

# A SURVEY OF REGISTERED NEW HAMPSHIRE VOTERS

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# Survey Notes

These results are from a Saint Anselm College Survey Center poll based on online surveys of 2083 New Hampshire registered voters. Surveys were collected between July 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>, 2024, from cell phone users randomly drawn from a sample of registered voters reflecting the demographic and partisan characteristics of the voting population. Names were presented in random order for the favorability and ballot questions. The survey has an overall margin of sampling error of +/- 2.1% with a confidence interval of 95%. The data are weighted for age, gender, geography, and education based on a voter demographic model derived from historical voting patterns, but are not weighted by party registration or party identification.

# Summary

**New Hampshire Institute of Politics Executive Director Neil Levesque summarized the results, saying, “With President Joe Biden bowing out of the race and endorsing his Vice President Kamala Harris, the presidential campaign has been reset as Harris has become the new favorite to win New Hampshire. Free of Biden’s baggage, Harris consolidates her party, enough to give her a 6-point edge.”**

**Former President Donald Trump remains the same candidate he was in June.** 43% of respondents have a favorable opinion of Trump versus 56% that have an unfavorable opinion. This is virtually identical to his 42%-57% favorable rating in June.

**Presumptive Democratic nominee Kamala Harris is a stronger candidate than President Joe Biden.** Harris’ image is even at 49%-49%. This is a significant improvement over Biden’s net negative 20 points (39%-59%) recorded in June.

**The candidates’ relative popularity translates directly into a ballot lead for Harris.** Harris currently leads Trump by 6 points, 50%-44%.

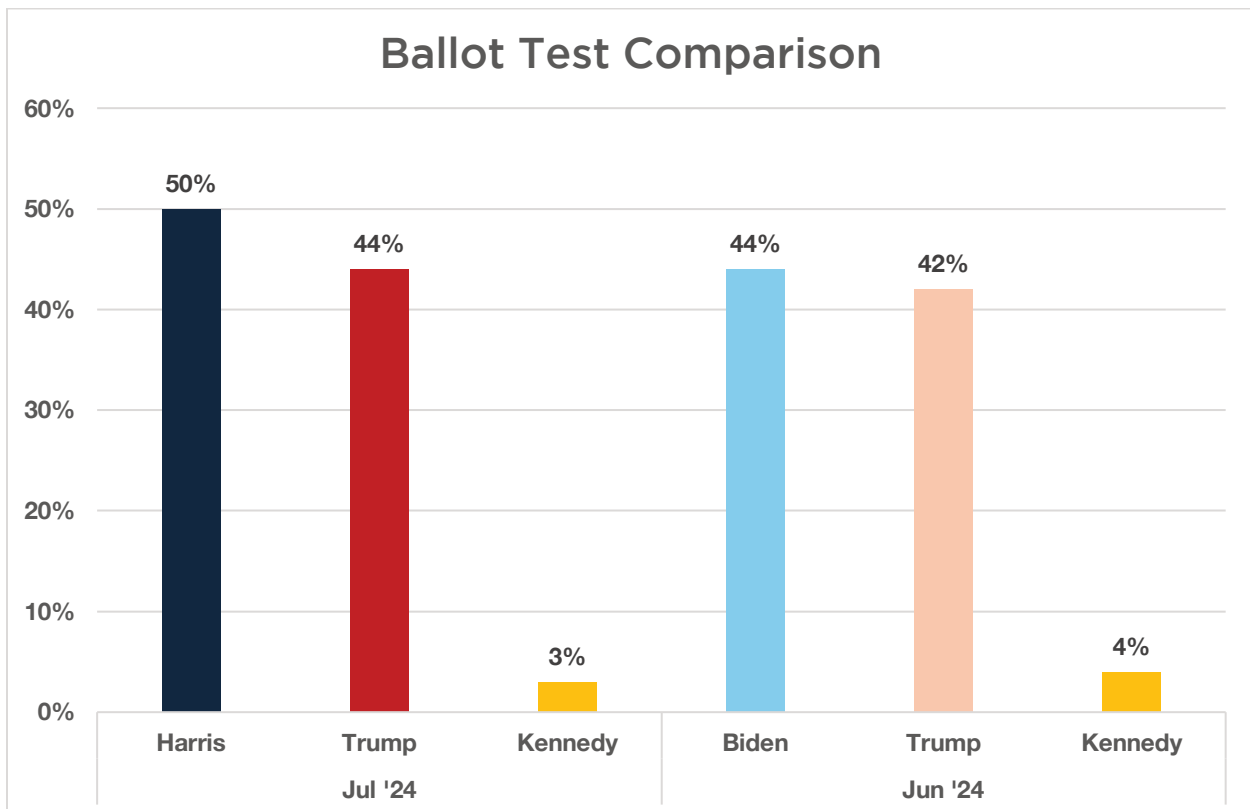
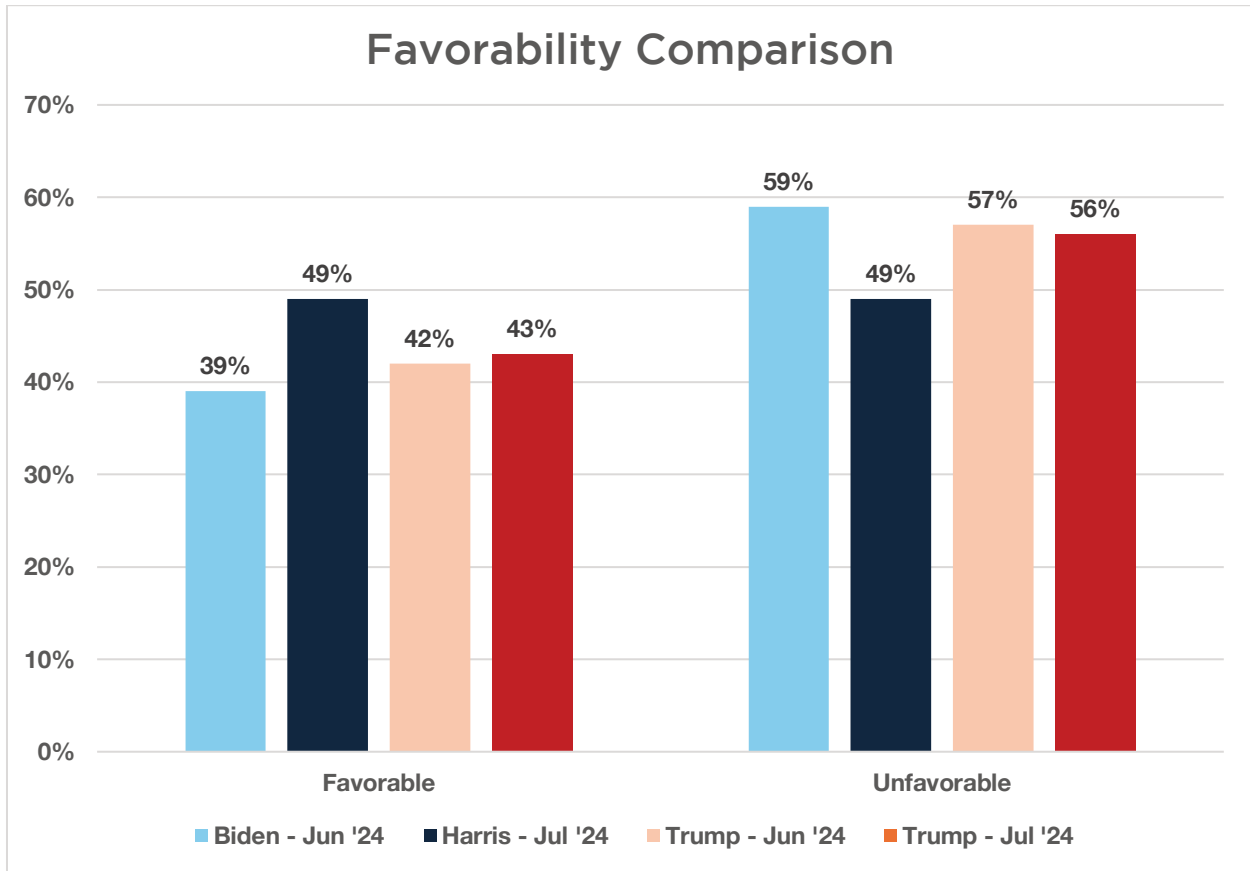
**Trump hasn’t lost support; Harris consolidates votes that Biden left scattered.** Trump led Biden 44%-42% in June. Harris improves over Biden by 8 points by taking 4 points from minor candidates and 4 points from “unsure”.

**Whereas Biden underperformed the generic ballot, Harris runs ahead of her party.** At 42% on the ballot, Biden trailed the generic Democratic ballot by 4 points in June. By contrast, Harris’s 50% is 3 points ahead of the current generic Democratic ballot.

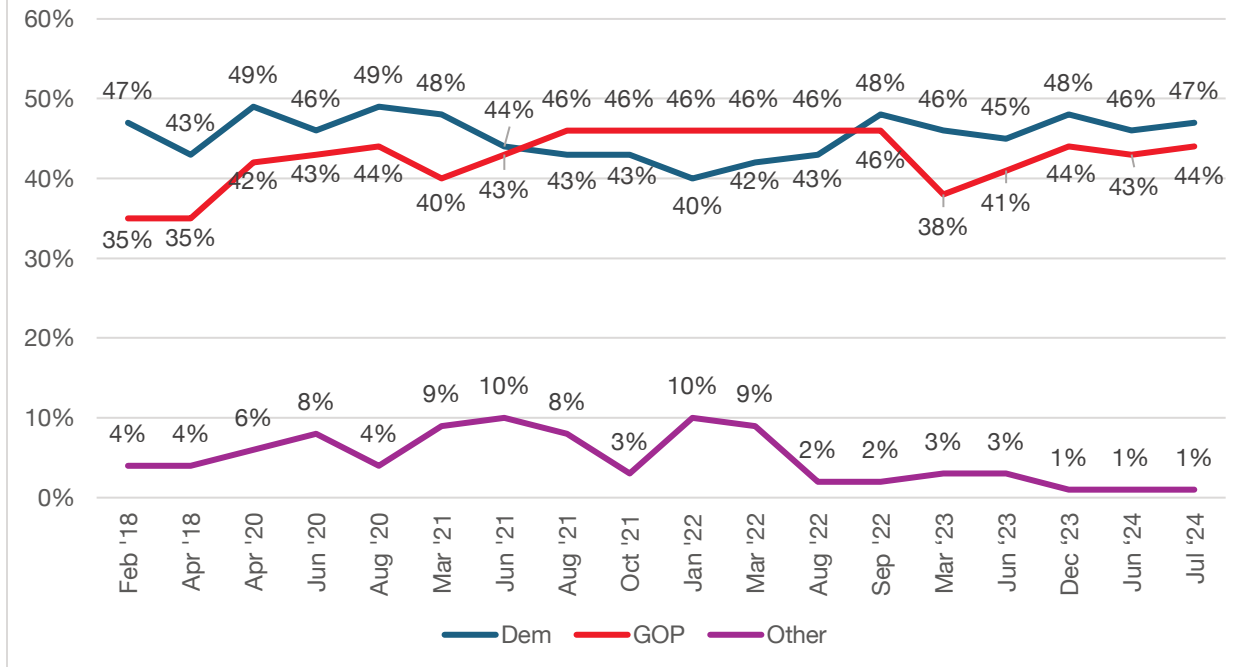
**Harris has gained the partisan intensity that eluded Biden.** 94% of Democratic voters are supporting Harris, compared to only 82% that were supporting Biden in June.

**Liberal voters have come home for Harris.** Biden suffered a notable weakness among his party’s liberal base, garnering support from only 83% of somewhat liberal and 67% of very liberal voters. By contrast, Harris gets 92% and 95% respectively.

**The presidential campaign will likely remain fluid throughout the fall as Harris takes center stage for the first time during this contest.** Voters may adjust their perception of the Vice President as the race settles in the coming weeks.
