

A SURVEY OF REGISTERED NEW HAMPSHIRE VOTERS

August 13-14, 2024

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Survey Notes

These results are from a Saint Anselm College Survey Center poll based on online surveys of 1656 New Hampshire registered voters. Surveys were collected between August 13th and 14th, 2024, from cell phone users randomly drawn from a sample of registered voters reflecting the demographic and partisan characteristics of the voting population. Names were presented in random order for the ballot tests. The survey has an overall margin of sampling error of +/- 2.4% with a confidence interval of 95%. The data are weighted for age, gender, geography, and education based on a voter demographic model derived from historical voting patterns, but are not weighted by party registration or party identification.

Summary

New Hampshire Institute of Politics Executive Director Neil Levesque summarized the results, saying, “As the Democratic Convention kicks off, Vice President Kamala Harris has built on her July lead, and is now ahead of former President Donald Trump by 7 points, 51%-44%. This reflects not only her popularity advantage, but also the popularity advantage enjoyed by her running mate, Minnesota Governor Tim Walz. Trump and running mate Ohio Senator J.D. Vance will have to cut into their opponents’ relative popularity if they are to make New Hampshire competitive in November.”

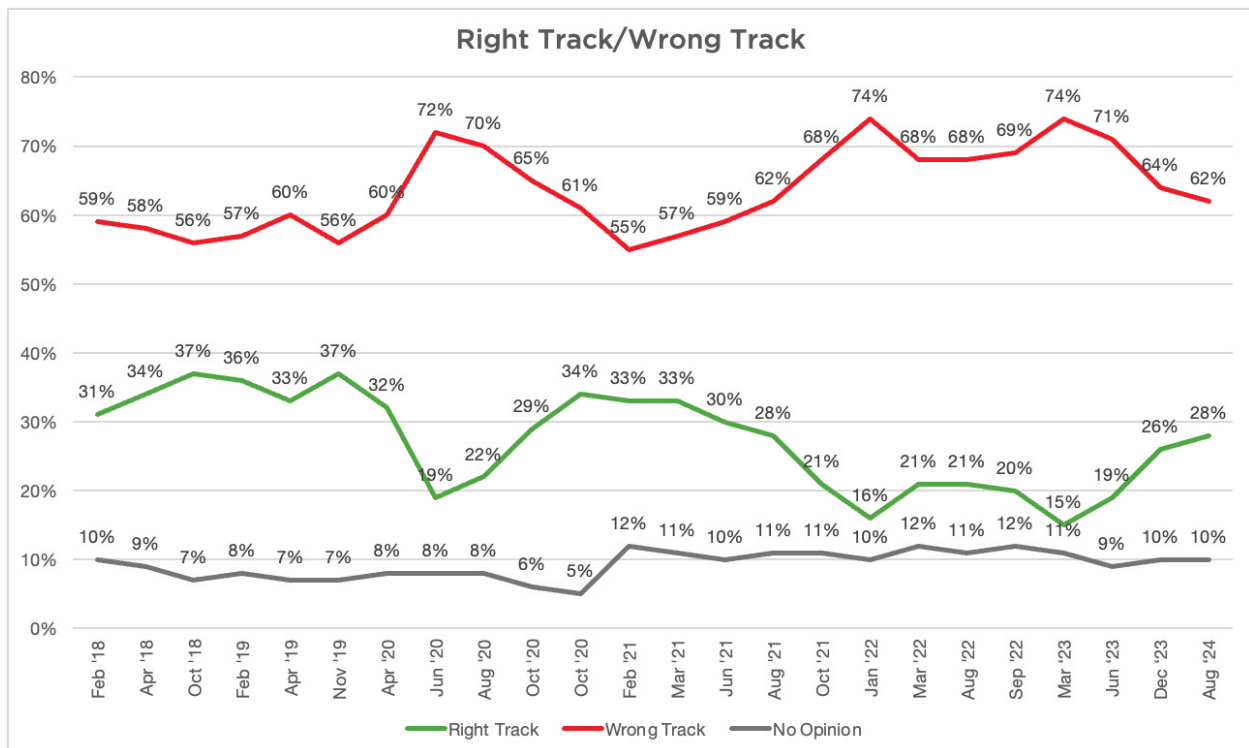
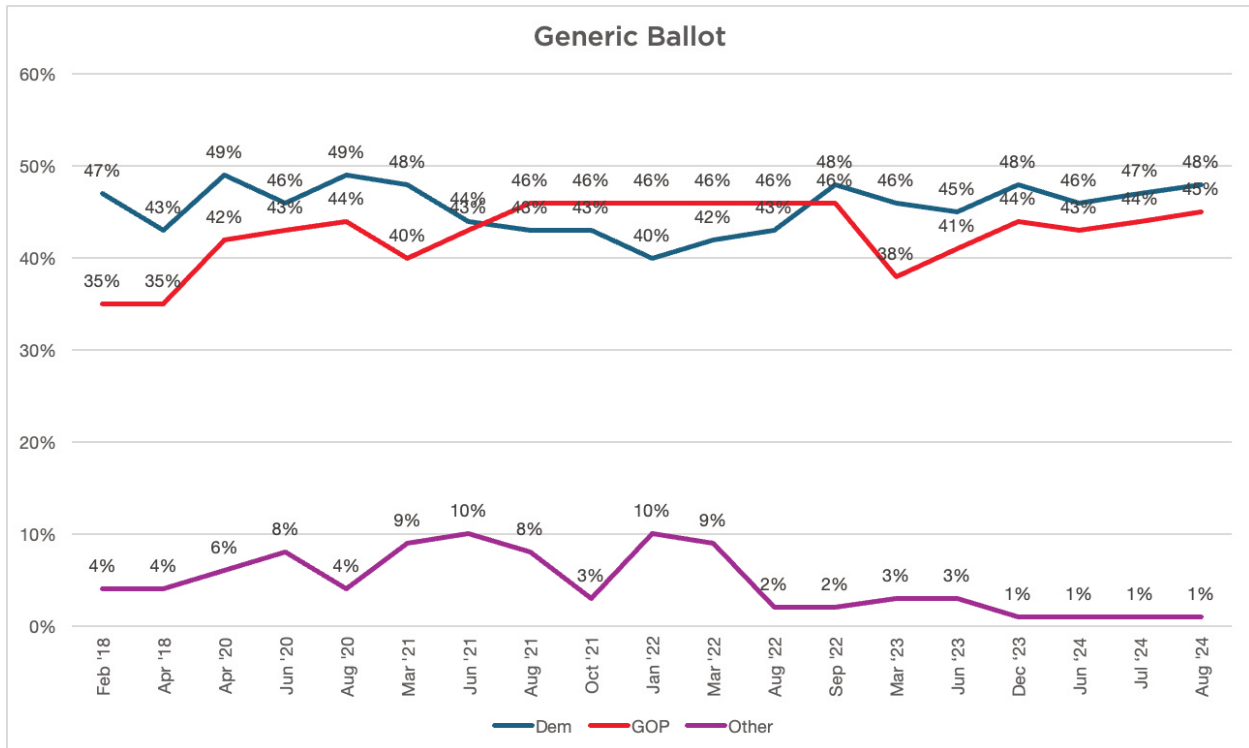
Kamala Harris is slightly above water on her image among voters. She currently enjoys a 51%-48% favorability, up slightly from 49%-49% in July.

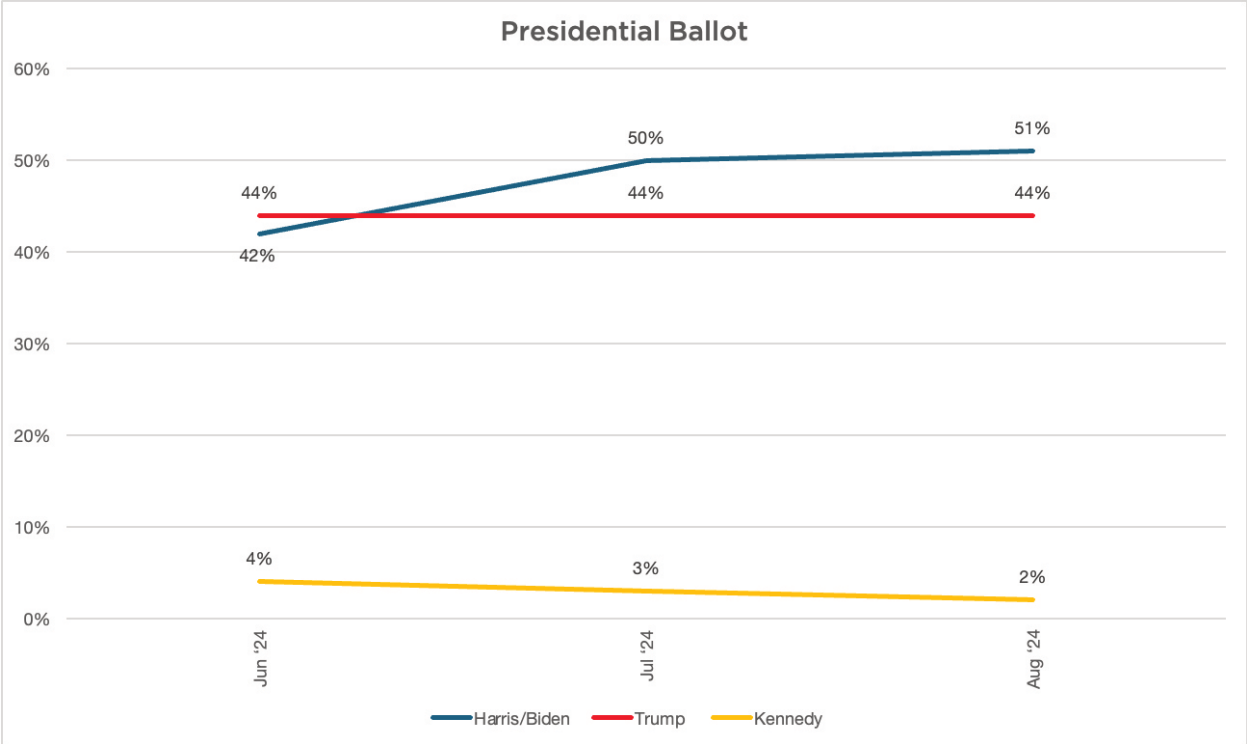
Donald Trump remains relatively unpopular. At 43%-57% favorable, Trump is well underwater, and has deteriorated slightly since July, when he stood at 43%-56%.

Tim Walz is far more popular than J.D. Vance. Walz stands at 50%-41% favorable, making him the best regarded among the four candidates. Vance got off to a rocky start, and is less popular than Trump at 41%-53%.

The key to Harris’ lead is partisan intensity. Whereas President Joe Biden was getting support from just 82% of Democratic voters in June, Harris has consolidated her party and is getting 94% of the Democratic vote. By contrast, Trump is getting only 90% of the Republican vote.
