A SURVEY OF LIKELY NEW HAMPSHIRE VOTERS October 28-29th, 2024

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Survey Notes

These results are from a Saint Anselm College Survey Center poll based on online surveys of 2791 New Hampshire likely voters. Surveys were collected between October 28th and 29th, 2024, from cell phone users randomly drawn from a sample of registered voters reflecting the demographic and partisan characteristics of the voting population. Names were presented in random order for the favorability and ballot tests. The survey has an overall margin of sampling error of +/- 1.9% with a confidence interval of 95%; the margin of sampling error for questions specific to the 1st and 2nd Congressional Districts is +/- 2.6%. The data are weighted for age, gender, geography, and education based on a voter demographic model derived from historical voting patterns, but are not weighted by party registration or party identification.

Summary

New Hampshire Institute of Politics Executive Director Neil Levesque summarized the results, saying, "With just one week remaining until Election Day, Vice President Kamala Harris maintains a lead over former President Donald Trump in New Hampshire. Former Senator Kelly Ayotte remains just shy of 50% in the governor's race, but still boasts a slim lead over former Manchester Mayor Joyce Craig.

Republicans overall continue to gain on the generic ballot. The Democratic lead has been steadily diminishing and now stands at 49%-47%.

Vice President Kamala Harris is up by 5 points coming into the stretch run. She now leads former President Donald Trump, 51%-46%, a bit closer than her 51%-44% lead in October as Trump consolidates remaining undecided voters.


Former Senator Kelly Ayotte maintains her lead over former Manchester Mayor Joyce Craig. She now leads 49%-46% as she and Craig continue to divvy up remaining undecideds. Ayotte's 3-point lead remains unchanged from early October, when she led 47%-44%.


Ayotte enjoys some buoyancy from Trump by successfully splitting Undeclared voters. Ayotte carries these voters by a slim margin, 48%-45%, even as Trump loses them 51%-44%.


Democratic Congressional candidates continue to be better known than their Republican counterparts. 1st Congressional District Congressman Chris Pappas enjoys a 51%-40% favorable image, while 2nd Congressional District Democratic candidate Maggie Goodlander carries a 45%-29% favorable image. Republican candidates Russell Prescott (32%-28%) and Lily Tang Williams (35%-33%) are still relatively unknown.


Democrats have the advantage in the Congressional races. Pappas leads Prescott 50%-43% in his re-election bid, while Goodlander outpaces Tang Williams 51%-43%.




