A SURVEY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE REGISTERED VOTERS

March 5-7, 2025

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Survey Notes

These results are from a Saint Anselm College Survey Center poll based on online surveys of 1597 New Hampshire registered voters. Surveys were collected between March 5th and 7th, 2025, from cell phone users randomly drawn from a sample of registered voters reflecting the demographic and partisan characteristics of the voting population. Names were presented in random order for the favorability and ballot tests. The survey has an overall margin of sampling error of +/- 2.5% with a confidence interval of 95%. The data are weighted for age, gender, geography, and education based on a voter demographic model derived from historical voting patterns, but are not weighted by party registration or party identification.

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Summary

New Hampshire Institute of Politics Executive Director Neil Levesque summarized the results, saying, "President Donald Trump continues to be a polarizing figure in New Hampshire. However, voters are somewhat more optimistic about the direction of the country than they have historically been, and there is clear differentiation in the popularity of his policies. That much said, his economic policies are coming up short on support, which should be taken as a warning considering the economy continues to be the top voter concern. As we look ahead to the midterm elections, it is worth noting that Republican voters are happy with their party, whereas Democratic voters are fractured."

President Donald Trump begins his term with a modest bump in popularity. 46% of voters have a favorable impression of Trump versus 53% with an unfavorable impression. This is a slight improvement from just before last November's election, when he sat at 44%-55%.

Trump's election has given voters significantly more optimism. 44% of voters believe the country is now heading in the right direction, well above the previous high recorded on this poll of 37% in November 2019.

The economy continues to be voters' top concern. 23% cited the economy/inflation as the most important issue facing our country, followed by elections/democracy at 19% and government spending/taxes at 15%.

88% of voters are concerned about the national debt. Only 12% report little to no concern.

Trump scores good marks for his handling of undocumented immigrants and his executive order declaring two and only two sexes. 55% approve of his deportations, and 52% approve of his executive order on sexes.


Trump receives less than majority support for the rest of his policies that were tested in this survey. 48% support his actions on diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI). 45% approve of how his Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE) is cutting government spending and employees. 43% approve of how he handled his recent meeting with Ukrainian President Zelenskyy. A scant 26% support his plan to take over the Gaza Strip.

Of particular note, Trump's economic policies are struggling to win support. Only 46% approve of his overall handling of the economy, and only 41% support 25% tariffs on Canada and Mexico, which has so far been his signature issue.


Republican voters are happy with the direction of their party; Democratic voters are not.


A remarkable 91% of self-identified Republicans report being happy with the direction of the Republicans. Only 29% of self-identified Democrats report the same. This suggests that Democrats lack a unifying figure that can compete with Trump's hold on his own party.
